# FROM BECKY RENO

High School Director of Student Life

At BCS students are not just educated—they are formed in how they live, serve, and follow Christ. As Director of Student Life, I have a unique vantage point; I get to watch our students choose relationships in a way that is increasingly rare.

I see it in how our students serve others on purpose. Whether they are hosting “Breakfast Buddies” with our kindergartners, heading out in their House Groups to serve across Billings, or finding ways to serve within our own school, they are learning to live differently. In a culture that often encourages self-focus, our students are discovering the truth of Luke 6: that the measure they give will be given back to them—pressed down, shaken together, and running over.

I see it on late-start mornings. Our Student Council has created and now runs its own coffee shop, Speakeasy, a space set apart for worship, Bible studies, and authentic community. While some may assume a Christian school shelters students from the real world, that isn’t what is happening here. Our students face the same anxieties and challenges as any teenager, but they are learning something distinct: how to invite God into the middle of it. They are building rhythms of faith and community that many students don’t experience elsewhere.

In a world that often tells teenagers to look out for themselves, I am grateful to watch ours look out for others. This is what sets BCS apart. Students are not just growing academically. They are being formed into young people who know Christ, serve others, and live with purpose. What a beautiful thing to witness! God is welcome here, and He is moving.



## The Impact of Your Generosity

Thanks to the generosity of our community, students are experiencing meaningful growth in hands-on learning. We are adding three 3D printers for our Engineering and Design class, where students will create and bring their own designs to life. Our science labs are also being equipped with advanced Vernier technology that will allow students to collect and graph real-time data. In addition, a new middle school drone curriculum was purchased in order to expand opportunities for innovation and exploration.

At BCS, where we have the opportunity to teach a student academically *and* spiritually, this often leads to a two-fold celebration with the students as they experience growth in their education and spiritual lives.

Academically speaking, as students write papers in ELA, they often face significant challenges and discouragement, especially at the beginning of the school year. But towards the end of the school year, they become confident writers and communicators who learn from their mistakes and enjoy celebrating their successes. There is so much joy in teaching when a student finally conquers a skill or understands a concept they have worked so diligently to master.

As a Bible teacher, I have the awesome privilege of encouraging students spiritually as we explore Bible lessons or practice Scripture memory. Especially meaningful are the moments when I get to see God show up in big ways as students navigate difficult life challenges. Middle school students often face many physical, emotional, social, and spiritual challenges—sometimes all at once. There is a palpable presence of God in our classroom when a student who has shared a struggle or heartache finally sees God at work in the situation we have prayed over together.

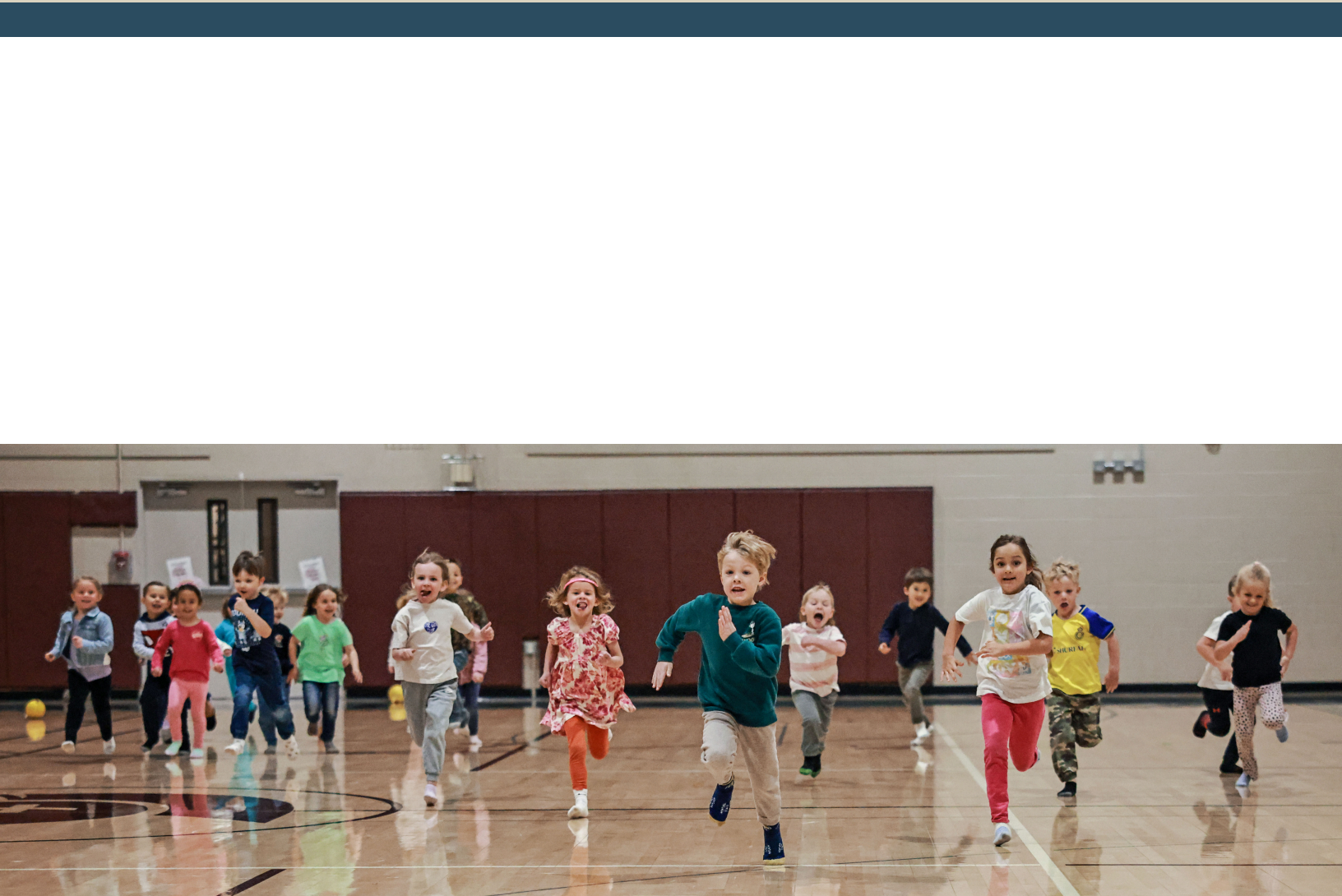
